Failures

The Local Authority data for **Victoria Pier** has 2 samples failing the mandatory bathing water standards out of 25 collected by them. Bathing water compliance rules are such that this constitutes a failure of mandatory standards. (The rules are 0 failures permitted if 1-19 samples, 1 failure permitted if 20 to 39 samples, 2 failures permitted if 40 to 59 samples). I do not consider it appropriate to pool both the Local Authority and Environment Agency samples as some cover the same time period. If we take the 20 Environment Agency results collected in May to September plus 15 Local Authority samples collected January to April and October to December then the bathing water does not meet the mandatory compliance requirements (2 failures in 35) . **On the basis of their application Victoria Pier does not qualify for a 12 month award.**

They therefore successfully applied for a summer only award.
