### Some highlights so far....

- Created 0.25 ha saltmarsh at Itchenor.
- Visited by HRH Princess Eugenie and SoS Therese Coffey.
- Built 0.25 ha oyster reef in the River Hamble.
- Constructed 4 new seabird breeding islands at Farlington Marshes.
- Created a central data system to enable change to be monitored.
- Released 2 films about our work so far.
- Become a pilot project for development of biodiversity credits.
- Marine Volunteer group established.
- Commissioned a State of Solent Nature Report.



Our long-term vision is to protect and restore the Solent, tipping the balance of the Solent seascape from a degraded state to a naturally expanding, connected and productive ecosystem.



## Seascape Recovery Plan

- Remove or reduce anthropogenic pressures on existing habitats to promote recovery.
- Illustrate sites across the seascape suitable for active restoration.
- Co-designed with stakeholders.
- Underpinned by best available evidence and local stakeholder knowledge.
- Develop a series of "tools" to better protect habitats and manage activities.
- Created over the next 4 years.

#### Data Portal and State of Nature Report

- SSP has commissioned ABPmer to create a data portal.
- Relevant Solent data will be layered in one place, including gap analysis.
- Iterative creation process with each stage informing the next.
- Should reveal where habitats are, habitat condition, pressures affecting habitats, existing management measures and gaps.
- ABPmer will write a State of Solent Nature Report based on technical information gathered in the portal.
- State of Nature Report will form an integral part of the evidence base used by stakeholders when co-designing the Seascape Recovery Plan.



### Stakeholder Engagement Strategy

- Time is the most precious thing of all.
- Large number of new initiatives in the Solent working to restore nature.
- Co-design is important for buy-in to the Seascape Recovery Plan, plan success and legacy.
- Working with Resources for Change we will work with stakeholders to see how they want to engage with us.
- Plan to work with other projects and initiatives, just like today, to gather stakeholder information concurrently and minimise stakeholder fatigue.

- Recognising the importance of the Solent for nature HCC and loWC want to include a "Marine and Coastal" chapter in their LNRS.
- Outputs from today's workshop will contribute to the marine and coastal chapter of the strategic LNRS draft document to be submitted to DEFRA in the spring.
- Solent Seascape Project will work with stakeholders over the coming years to develop the detailed, co-designed plan which will ultimately become the "marine/coastal proposals" included as part of the LNRS.
