Recent Examples of Current Work

- New web hub created on beneficial use of dredgings (BuDS) links to Solent BuDS marine licence applications.
- Invited to sit on the national BuDS working group and in July presented to that group on what we are doing in the Solent and the issues we are experiencing.
- Support letter for Langstone Harbour Board's Fisheries and Seafood Scheme bid.
- Fed into Chichester DC Biodiversity Action Strategy and Chichester Harbour National Landscape Management Plan 2025 to 2030.
- Climate change discussion with Portsmouth CC on coastal issues.
- Sit on IoW LNRS Steering Group and inputting into coast sections of Hampshire LNRS.
- Supporting the work of the Solent Seascape project on Solent nature recovery.
- Trustee of the national Coastal Partnership Network charity.
- Attending Catchment Partnership meetings with river colleagues.





Forum Led/Funded Project Updates

- O Beneficial use of Dredgings in Solent (BUDS) phase 4, commissioned August 2025, ABPmer will repurpose the withdrawn Phase 3 Marine Licence and the baseline document to apply for a licence for a new disposal site at Cockleshell Bay, Lymington. Project group overseeing the work, Solent Forum project managing. Licence should go in late 2025.
- Supporting the national Coastal Partnership Network 3Cs bid to establish a national framework for coastal partnerships across the UK (bid successful).
- Natural Environment Group funded project a study of pharmaceutical drug accumulation in Solent fish, University of Southampton. Currently underway.



Solent Forum Members Survey: Responses by Organisation Type




Awareness of the Solent Forum's Business Plan 2025 to 2030?





Barriers to Attendance




'So pleased I have joined this forum as part of my work, valuable contacts have been made'
